Stanwood Camano Food Bank News

The Stanwood Camano Food Bank currently serves over 500 local families on a regular basis. Distributing an average of 45,000 lbs. of food monthly, the Food Bank is in constant need of donations. Donations are welcomed Tuesdays thru Fridays from 9am to 1:00pm at the Food Bank or Mondays thru Saturdays at the Thrift Store next door, anytime between 10:00am to 4:00pm. Monetary donations may also be sent to the SC Food Bank at PO Box 1285, Stanwood, WA 98292.

Items most needed are fresh produce, baby food, canned goods, cereal, macaroni and cheese, tuna, Spam, canned meats, pasta, pasta sauce, canned fruit and personal care items.

We are currently preparing for the annual US Postal Food Drive on Saturday, May 9th. The Food Bank receives an average of 20,000 pounds of food on this one day, and the need for volunteers to assist in unloading, sorting and boxing this amount of goods is great. Anyone interested in assisting should contact Wendy Foster, the Food Bank's volunteer coordinator.

The Food Bank is also changing its hours of food distribution. Beginning Friday, May 1, 2015, the hours of distribution will be 10:00am to 1:00pm each Wednesday and Friday. And, beginning June 6, 2015, the Food Bank will be open on Saturday mornings from 10:00am to 12:00 noon. This is meant to provide food service to those families who are unable to get to the Food Bank during its regular week day hours. This will be a twomonth trial, after which, the Food Bank will assess the usage factor to determine whether or not it should be made permanent.

Pentecost is the fiftieth day of Easter and the Days of Pentecost continue until the Advent season. This year Pentecost begins Sunday, May 24th. The church has moved from the empty tomb and a focus on the risen Lord through his ascension. Now the church moves into a new relationship with him in and by the power of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost is the day to welcome the gift of the Spirit and interpret that gift afresh.

The Season of Pentecost focuses on the Spirit and the way in which it touches everyone in the world. Pentecost is a time of outreach, praise, spiritual renewal, and fellowship. In most churches, the general theme of the Bible readings and sermons during the Pentecost season concern the church's mission in the world. The color of the season is Red. It is appropriate to wear red on Sunday, May 24th; in fact, we encourage it!

Doves are a symbol of Pentecost, symbolizing the descent of the Holy Spirit at the baptism of Jesus.

The cupboards are bare after the Missions Committee members delivered five Welcome Boxes and five Best Wishes Boxes in March and April. Can you help with money or items for the boxes to replenish the supplies for the boxes? With donated funds, our super-shoppers find the best deals on the needed items.

After a rather slow winter, the Interfaith Family Shelter in Everett has had many residents finding more permanent housing and moving out. New homeless families are moving in. So the cycle goes. A staff member just called to say that they need more Welcome and Best Wishes Boxes.

The Missions Committee with help from the ConneXion Groups and the United Methodist Women have provided support for the Interfaith Association of the Northwest's Family Shelter Project in Everett. From April 2014 to April 2015, the SUMC provided 31 Welcome Boxes and 24 Best Wishes Boxes as well as blankets, dinnerware, bowls and cups.

The mission project involves providing Welcome Boxes for families coming into the Family Shelter and Best Wishes Boxes for families leaving the Family Shelter. The Welcome Boxes contained items needed by individuals and families that are staying in the shelter to get started on improving their lives. The Best Wishes Boxes help them with items that they will need to set up housekeeping in their new homes. Often these families come into the shelter with almost nothing.

With the renovation of Wesley Hall and to provide a more visible place to leave donations, the Missions Committee is eliminating the Food Bank Box next to the fireplace. We have acquired a grocery basket from QFC. Yes, they donated it for these worthy causes. The advantage of the new basket is that it is moveable. It can be placed anywhere in the church. On the basket will be a list of the items needed for the Food Bank as well as the items needed for the Welcome Boxes and the Best Wishes Boxes.

We thank you all for your continued support of this most important project.
